
ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN

NWCC Department

AND

Northwestern Connecticut CONNECTICUT COMMUNITY COLLEGE
Continuing Education and Extended Studies Division

This document delineates the policies of Northwestern Connecticut Community College's (NCCC) Div/Department/ Program for awarding transfer credit to students who have completed non-credit coursework and/or Workforce Development programs through Northwestern Connecticut Community College's Continuing and Extended Studies Division (CEES). This agreement is intended to facilitate transfer of Northwestern Connecticut Community College Continuing Education and Extended Studies students who wish to continue their education in pursuit of an Associate Degree or Certificate.

The Continuing Education and Extended Studies Division provides high-quality, non-traditional education leading to an Associate degree or a Bachelor degree with a focus on workforce development. The Continuing Education and Extended Studies Division provides classes designed for adult learners who have work experience and who wish to maintain their professional and personal activities while pursuing their education goals.

The policies outlined below govern the granting of credit by Northwestern Connecticut Community College for rigorous education work done elsewhere. This agreement is for Continuing Education and Extended Studies *course(s) completed with a minimum of C or its equivalent of P (Pass) at NCCC, a fully accredited institution by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges, to be considered transferable as collegiate level courses. The selected CCE Division courses within this agreement are to be considered equivalent to college credit bearing course(s) based upon corresponding learning outcomes, appropriate instruction, and classroom hours. These courses may be used as general education or elective courses in agreed upon programs of study.

A maximum of # credits is transferable from an accredited college for work done satisfactorily (C or better). Pass/Satisfactory grades for Continuing Education and Extended Studies courses are considered a C or better grade thereby transferable as credit courses.

Upon evaluation, courses will be considered equivalent on the basis of agreed upon parameters. The following general requirements for the consideration and evaluation of non-credit/continuing Education and Extended Studies course(s) for credit are:

- The course must have a specific number of classroom hours.
- The course must contain the same content
- The course must have been taught by a qualified instructor.
- The student must have received a minimum grade of C or a P grade considered to be interchangeable as a letter grade of C or better.

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The course content must be similar in subject matter, level, and depth and contain the equivalent academic rigors as the course in the College's credit curriculum.

Northwestern Connecticut Community College Continuing Education and Extended Studies students interested in transferring non-credit/continuing Education and Extended Studies course work to the academic affairs/learning division of Northwestern Connecticut Community College are encouraged to consult with the Division/Department/Program Coordinator as soon as possible to establish the transfer of credit.

This articulation agreement serves as a formal recognition of policies already in effect at Northwestern Connecticut Community College regarding transfer credit from another college to Northwestern Connecticut Community College. It has been developed to facilitate and encourage the transfer of students between the departments within the institution, especially as they move from workforce continuing Education and Extended Studies to Certificate, Associate and Bachelor's degree programs.
