COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Title: Photography II

Course #: ART* 142

Course Description: Three (3) Credit Hours. This course provides theory and practice to a variety of photographic techniques sequential to those introduced in ART* 141. Topics include film and print manipulation, variables in exposure and development and printing, working with different films, print presentation, and analyzing photography as an art form.

Pre-requisite/Co-requisite:

Goals: To introduce advanced techniques and their applications in photography and how to apply them for creative and artistic expression.

Outcomes:

1. Students should know advanced techniques in photographic procedure.
2. Students should learn practical applications for the advanced techniques and how to develop control of them.
3. Students should be able to apply the advanced techniques for creative and artistic expression.
4. Students should be able to write artist statements to further express their creative goals.
