COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Title: Digital Video Postproduction **Course #:** ART* 275

Course Description: Three (3) credit hours – 6 studio/lab hours. Designed to be taken the semester immediately after ART* 274, Video & Motion Fundamentals. Students will utilize their pre-production and cinematography skills to produce a short dramatic narrative or short documentary, which will be entirely edited digitally. Digital audio and digital graphics will be added to complete the production. Final programs will be broadcast by local cable stations.

Pre-requisite/Co-requisite: ART* 274 and consent of the instructor

Goals: To teach advanced video production techniques that will culminate into a completely digitally edited video program.

Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course the student should be able to:

1. Create their own story concept demonstrated by the production of a treatment, storyboards, and a short script.
2. Light and shoot a digital video production film-style.
3. Edit digital video and design a digital sound track.
