COURSE SYLLABUS

Course Title: Visual Basic I

Course #: CSC* 205

Course Description: 3 Credits. A course in the Visual Basic programming language that uses modular coding and emphasizes object oriented techniques. This course addresses event driven programming in the Windows environment. This course is intended to fulfill an advanced programming requirement.

Pre-requisite/Co-requisite: CSC* 210 or previous programming experience with the consent of the instructor

Goals: Students are expected to

- be able to demonstrate knowledge and understanding of topics in the computing discipline and industry, both academically and within the needs of the workplace, as defined by the listed outcomes below.
- be able to articulate both verbally and written their scope of expertise in completing the study of course topics as they relate to the listed outcomes.
- increase their communication and presentation skills as they integrate computer knowledge into business systems using hardware and software components as required by the objectives in this course.

Outcomes: Upon successful completion of this course students will be able to:

- demonstrate analysis skills to determine program design in Visual Basic
- develop applications to solve problems and tasks in Visual Basic
- interpret and maintain existing Visual Basic programs
- apply a modular approach to solve large scale problems in Visual Basic
- use structured techniques in building programs in Visual Basic
